My dear Nephew,

I have just received your Letter acquainting me that a will of my late Brother has been found wherein He requests That he may be buried in the Vault He has had prepared in the Free Chapel of St. George, Windsor Castle. – This communication will certainly be attended to by me; But it changes the Funeral from a public to a private one; I have in consequence recalled the orders previously given and directed the Earl of Dartmouth to consult with you, that, at the same time care may be taken that any mark of Respect conformable to the mode now adopted be attended to
